Chairman's Message

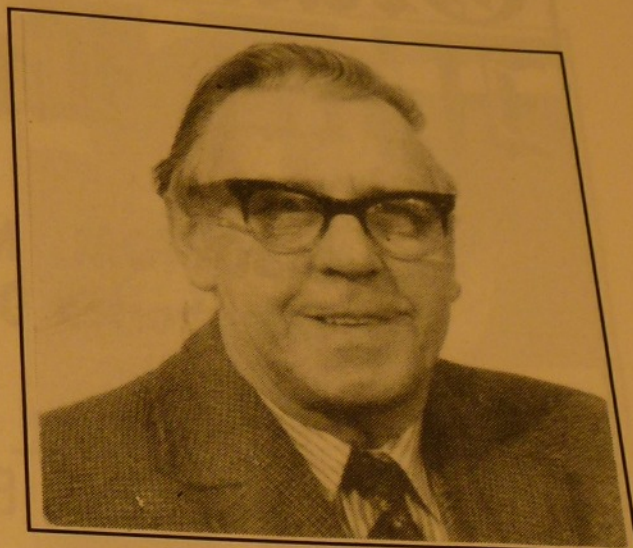

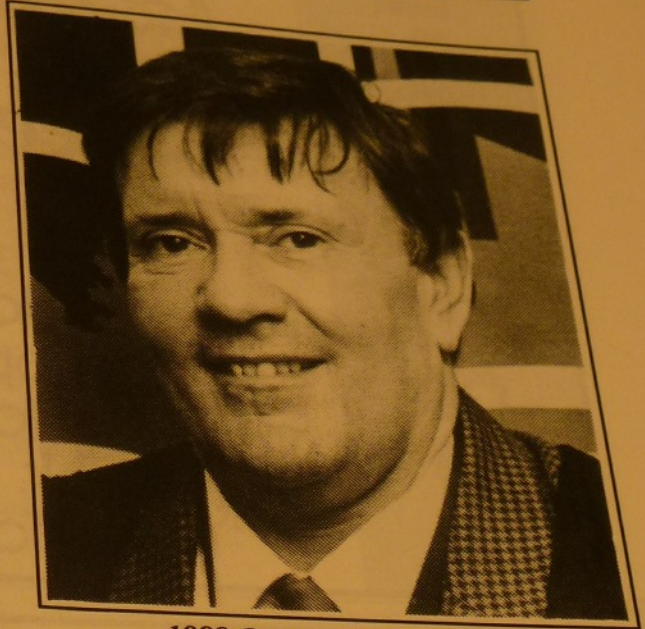

Report and Results of "Dog Show" 1988/89

After last year's success, we are extending the dog events this year, this will include a K.C. Reg. Exemption Show for Pedigree and none pedigree alike, with varieties, to cover the more fun aspect of showing.

The **Rochdale Lurcher & Terrier Club**, are this year organising the Terrier Lurcher part of our **DOG EXTRAVAGANZA** this will include 29 class and a running straight, to show the dogs on the move. Also for your entertainment we are incorporating six classes of ferrets.

The **SCURRY** for people not familiar with this event, it involves two marked retrievers. The first across water, with a seen landing of the dummy to be retrieved and returned to the handler. The second retrieve is when the dummy is thrown but the dog does not see where it has landed, and therefore has to reach for it and again return it to the handler.

The winner of this event, is the dog who completes both retrieves in the shortest time. A simpler double retrieve will be available, the **NOVICE SCURRY** which involves two seen retrieves against the clock.

There will also be demonstrations by a professional dog handler and his helpers to show Obedience, Agility and personal protection. Also we are organising a **GUNDOG PARADE** this will allow you to see many Gundogs including Spaniels, Retrievers, Setters, Pointers and many more gathered from the North West for your viewing satisfaction.

The Northern England Falconry Club was founded almost twenty-five years ago in the West Riding of Yorkshire by a small number of local falconers. Over the years the membership has steadily increased, gradually drawing hawk keepers from wider parts of the north.

The club holds regular monthly meetings in Skarifford where different aspects of the sport are discussed. The main aims of the club are to preserve the art of falconry and to continue, this, the oldest of traditional country sports. Almost all of the hawks that are trained are caught and bred. The club itself has its own breeding projects where attempts are being

made to produce birds for falconry. The members of the club provide displays for the public throughout the summer at varying country fairs. It is hoped that these demonstrations help promote falconry but at the same time emphasize the great daily responsibilities needed when keeping birds of prey. Anyone wishing to find more out about this ancient sport should go along to the static display where members of the club will be pleased to answer any questions.

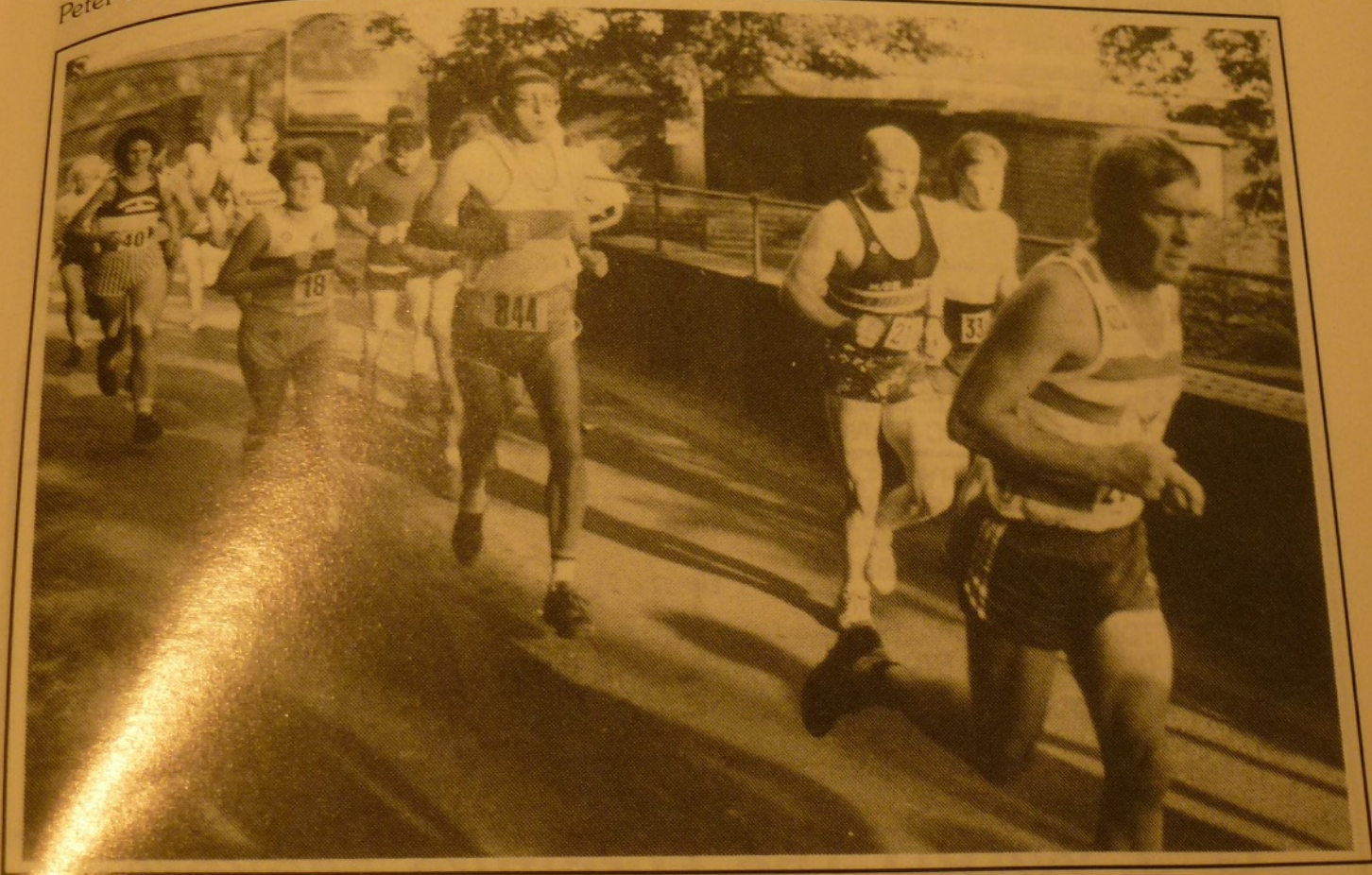
