2020 – *“Plans to beef up Ramsbottom restaurant's reputation. The owners of an award-winning restaurant are bidding for a return to their agricultural roots.*

While building up The Fisherman's Retreat in Ramsbottom, the Magnall family owned the nearby Twine Valley Farm.

Borough planners in Rossendale have been told while the farm building and beef herd were sold in 2010, the family had retained the majority of the land, an estimated 12.7 hectares or so.

Planning agent Jim Eccles said the herd had now been re-established, to supply the restaurant with dry aged beef.

The cattle have been housed in a nearby building but the Magnalls now wanted to erect a 30-metre long unit, on their own land, as a permanent arrangement.

Mr Eccles said: "The applicant is continuing to increase their cattle stock up to the 100 head of cattle that they had previously maintained up to 2010 at Twine Valley Farm."

An area of hardstanding would be created at the site, to the south of Riding Head Lane, as part of the overall plans, with the building split according to stock requirements.

Phil Durnall, Lancashire County Council's highways and transport director, has not objected to the scheme.

He has told planners: "The proposal is for the construction of an agricultural building and apart from the initial construction phase, the traffic generated by the proposal is likely to be minimal and ancillary to the existing farming operations."

The venture was named the best in the food and drink class at the most recent Made In Bury business awards.

And Hervey Magnall Snr, who has been in the restaurant trade for 27 years and has a five-decade long working life, was named Businessman of the Year at the same ceremony.

He described the Bury area as a "great place to be" as he picked up his honour."

2011 - The Eagle and Child had nearly an acre of unused space, covered in brambles and flying tipping. This has now been changed into a quirky landscaped garden, landscaped so guests can enjoy eating and drinking amongst the home grown fruit and vegetables.

2016 – Planning application for the Eagle and Child, 3 Whalley Road, Shuttleworth. Change of use of first floor to bed and breakfast creating 5 bedrooms with juliet balcony to 2 bedrooms and single storey extension to rear.

2017 – Eagle & Child wins John Smith's Patnership Pub of the Year and Great British Pub of the Year, Glen Duckett, licensee of the Daniel Thwaites tenancy.

2019 - At the end of the “Bee in the City” event in Manchester, most of the bee sculptures were auctioned and the proceeds given to charity. This one now sits in the BEE(r) garden at the Eagle and Child pub/restaurant at Ramsbottom. It was originally number 100 on the trail and was positioned by the lake at Heaton Park. See photograph.

Grants Tower

1783 - *"William Grant tells us that on that memorable autumn evening, in 1783, when the family reached the spot where Grants Tower now stands, and his father exclaimed : " What a beautiful valley ! May God almighty bless it! It reminds me of Speyside, but the Irwell is not so large as the River Spey," Messrs. Peel and Yates were just beginning to build their print works at Ramsbottom."*

1827 - *"In 1818 we purchased Springside, and in 1827 we purchased the Park estate, and erected a monument to commemorate my father's first visit to this valley, and on the very spot where he and I stood admiring the beautiful scenery below. There is a fine view from the top of the tower in a clear day, and the Welsh mountains can be descried in the distance."*

1829 – Grants Tower was built by Christopher Garnett. It was 50 feet high, 800 feet above sea level, 4 flights of stairs, 84 individual steps and 8 turrets at the top (two of which were disguised chimneys for fireplaces below.)

1830s – *"The Nightingale Family. Referring again to Edward NIGHTINGALE, one time occupant of Grants Tower, he was born in Blackburn about 1811. He married Elizabeth ODDIE of Clitheroe at Clitheroe Parish Church on 10th September 1836. He lived for a time in Catealon Street, off Walmersley Road, Bury, but by 1881 he was living at Lower Nuttall. His second wife was Mary. Edward and Elizabeth had seven children. Benjamin was the eldest, born in Grants Tower on 20th September 1837".*

1830's - In earlier years, the tower was a well visited site with a cafe as well as rides and swings for the children. It was as famous a landmark as Peel Tower on the opposite side of the valley.

1837 – Birth of Benjamin Nightingale, registered in Walmersley. Mother's name Oddie.

1850s - James Duncan Wright, born Dundee in 1829, on his way to join a ship, took up the offer of taking down a weather vane from a 150 foot (15 metres) steeple, without the use of ladders. Lord Elcho after seeing this feat gave him the nickname "Steeple Jack", his nickname has now become part of the English language. In the 1850's he and his family lived in Grants Tower, while working in Lancashire.

"When Wright said he would like to live in the tower, he was told it was not in a fit state and ad never been occupied. And, said, Daniel Grant, the place was haunted. I replied that I would take my chance, haunted or not, and if he would put it in repair, I would become his tenant. This he consented to do. After being repaired to my satisfaction, I got it comfortably furnished and took possession along with my family, under the title of Steeple Jack of the Tower of Ramsbottom."

"In 1880 it was lived in by the family of Mr. Nightingale, a forester who worked for the Grants. After a severe storm one night they thought it would collapse, and so were forced to abandon it, not to return."

1881 - *"When Jenny brought the lantern, I bade Nanny 'Good night," and took advantage of Owd Skedlock's convoy down the broken paths, to die high road in the valley. There we parted ; and I had a fine starlight walk to " Th' Top o' th' Hough " on that breezy October night.*

After a quiet supper in " Owd Bob's " little parlour, I took a walk round about the quaint farmstead, and through the grove upon the brow of the hill. The full moon had risen in the cloudless sky; and the view of the valley as I saw it from " Grant's Tower "' that night, was a thing to be remembered for a man's lifetime".

"Tufts of Heather" by Edwin Waugh, 1881 Page 175

1893 - *"On the top of the hill behind- "the Hoof"- and above Park Chapel and School, is seen Grant's Tower, fronted and flanked by a grove of hardy trees, and visible from afar. Like the Peel Monument on the opposite hill, it is a favourite resort of excursionists."*

"The last person to live there was Edwin Waugh, the dialect poet, sometimes referred to as the Lancashire Robert Burns. Whilst convalescing from illness at the tower it is claimed that he wrote Little Cattle, Little Care with the refrain "Lie thee down, laddie !" in which he is speaking to his dog at the end of the day. Here's a snippet: "We never owned a yard o' ground/ We'n little wealth in hand/ But thee an' me can sleep as sound/ As thi' richest folk it'h land"."

"By 1914 it was in need of restoration and so a fund was set up. By then the local farm at Top o' th' Hoof had become a pub called the Tower Inn and no doubt Grants Tower was still a draw."

1920s – *"When I Were A Lad. Grants Tower, gracing the summit of Top o'th'Hoof on the eastern side of the valley, was another of our destinations, being very well attended in those days. Families picnicked under its shadow, soaking up the fresh air of the hill tops, well away from the dozens of sooty chimneys and the dismal grey stone buildings below. The first landing of the tower contained a fine selection of slot machines. Many a hard earned penny was heard to rattle its way through their mechanisms, but what an immense amount of pleasure it gave to us all. Then upwards to the very top with views on a clear day stretching way across the Lancashire plain to the Welsh hills and beyond, accompanied by the laughing and shrieking of the people having the times of their lives in boat swings 40 feet below us."*

1939 - *"It was used by the Home Guard during the Second World War as a look out point, but during the war years the council closed it as it badly needed repairs. They also entered into negotiations with Peter Grant Lawson to buy it."*

It was not open to the public because it was in such a decrepit condition with much of the stone work having collapsed. This littered the ground around the base of this once proud tower. I was rather disappointed that I could never ascend the steps but of course to have tried to gain entry would have been foolhardy and extremely dangerous."*

1944 - Unfortunately it was left derelict for a number of years and it finally collapsed on 22nd September 1944.

2017 – Planning permission was granted to restore the ground floor and put a roof on it to keep it weather proof.

In recent years the ground floor has been renovated by the owner, Mr Gary Buckley.

St John in the Wilderness Church, Whalley Road, Shuttleworth.

1847 – Built, it was designed by Edwin Hugh Shellard.

1850 Heap's Directory – St. John the Evangelist Church, Shuttleworth—Rev. Hugh Pritchard Hughes, minister.

1851 Census – School House, Hugh Pritchard Hughes (43) born in North Wales and his wife, Emma (34) born in Swaffham, Norfolk

1853 Whellan Directory – The church dedicated to 'St John in the Wilderness' is a substantial edifice of hewn stone, built in 1847, and consecrated on the 12th February 1848. Its style of architecture is that which prevailed in the fourteenth century, and the cost of its erection was £2,100, towards which sum the Earl of Derby, who is the proprietor of nearly the whole parish, gave the site, and contributed £300; the Chester Diocesan Society £300, the Incorporated Society £250, and the Church Commissioners £200. The remainder, £1050, was raised by voluntary contributions. The first incumbent was Rev. H.P. Hughes.

1854 History and Directory of Mid-Lancashire - A church, dedicated to St John in the Wilderness, was erected here in 1847, and consecrated 12th of February, 1848. Its style of architecture is that which prevailed in the 14th century, and the cost of the church and schools amounted to £2,580 19s 10d., towards which the late Earl of Derby subscribed £300, the Diocesan Society £300, the Incorporated Society £250, the Church Commissioners £200, Richard Wild, Esq., £100, the Committee of Council on Education £200, and the National Society £180, the remainder being raised by smaller contributions. The living is a perpetual curacy, worth £152 per annum, in the alternate patronage of the Crown and the Bishop, and is now held by the Rev. H. P. Hughes.

1861 Census – St. John, Shuttleworth, Rev. H.P. Hughes (52) born in Llanelian, Anglesey, North Wales and his wife, Emma (48) born in Swaffham, Norfolk. Servant – Elizabeth Wall (29) born in Soham, Norfolk.

1871 Census – The Vicarage, Bank Lane, Hugh P. Hughes (64) born in Anglesey, North Wales and his wife, Emma (49?) born in Norfolk. Servant – Elizabeth Mace (35) born in Norfolk.

1871 Worrall's Directory – The church dedicated to St. John, consecrated in 1849, is a neat stone edifice in the style of architecture prevailing in the 14th century. The living is a perpetual curacy, of the annual value of £160 in the gift of the Crown and Bishop of Manchester alternately ; the present minister is the Rev. Hugh P. Hughes.

1875 – Death of Hugh Pritchard Hughes (68) registered in Walmersley.

We are so grateful to The Pets at Home Foundation, Battersea Dogs and Cats Home and The Bolton Guild J A & F Smith Animal Charity Fund for providing grants to fund the project.
